Regarding Time Tables—This Company will not be responsible for errors in time tables, inconvenience or damage resulting from delayed trains or failure to make connections; schedules and equipment shown herein are subject to change without notice

Buy Tickets before boarding trains and avoid payment of extra charge

Children under 5 years of age free, when accompanied by parents or guardian; 5 years of age and under 12, one-half fare, 12 years or over, full fare.

Adjustment of Fares.—In case of dispute with Conductors or Agents, pay fare required, take receipt and communicate with John G. Ronald, Division Passenger Sales Manager, Pittsburgh, Pa.

Redemption of Tickets.—Tickets unused or partly used will be redeemed under tariff regulations at proper value minus the applicable service charge in accordance with tariff regulations, lawfully on file with various regulatory bodies.

Marking Baggage for Identification.—Mark or tag each piece of your baggage with your name and address and place this information inside each piece, whether the baggage is checked or carried with you on the train.

Baggage Service.—Baggage may be checked for transportation, subject to tariff regulations; 150 pounds will be transported on full fare tickets and 75 pounds on half fare tickets without charge, except a service charge of 25c will be assessed for each suitcase or other piece of hand baggage and 50c for each trunk at time of checking. No single piece of baggage exceeding 300 pounds in weight or single shipment exceeding \$2,500.00 in value will be checked. The above arrangements are subject to tariff stipulations as to contents, weight, value and size.

Baggage Liability Limited.—Excess value to be declared and paid for at time of checking. **Bicycles (not Motorcycles), Baby Carriages, Dogs and Club Paraphernalia** are transported in baggage cars subject to tariff regulations. Dogs and small household pets (such as cats, birds, etc.), are transported in baggage cars subject to tariff regulations. Small dogs, cats, or other small animals (not vicious, odoriferous or otherwise objectionable) when carried in baskets or containers, may be taken by purchasers of drawing rooms, compartments or bedrooms into the rooms they occupy.

Exception.—The carrying of dogs or household pets (cats, birds, etc.) in sleeping or parlor cars from points in the United States to Canada is prohibited.

Baggage.—This Company cannot guarantee to forward baggage on same train with passenger and, when necessary, baggage of passengers will be forwarded on other trains. To facilitate prompt receipt of their baggage at destination, passengers are advised to arrange for forwarding on a preceding train.

Lost Articles.—When articles are lost on trains or left in waiting rooms at stations, owners should apply at once to agent at station where they leave the train. These railroads will not be responsible for unchecked articles left in stations or cars.

Free Side Trip.—All one-way or round-trip tickets reading to or beyond Rochester, N. Y. via New York Central System and valid for stop-over at Buffalo, N. Y., will be accepted (without additional collection) for free side trip Buffalo, N. Y. to Niagara Falls, N. Y. and return within limit of ticket.

Exchange Arrangements.—Passengers holding tickets reading via NYC RR between Albany, N. Y. and Chicago, Ill. or points beyond may have same exchanged at NYC RR Ticket Offices to read via NYC RR, Youngstown, P&LE RR, Pittsburgh, P&LE RR, Youngstown, Erie RR, Cleveland and NYC RR (via Elkhart), or vice versa.

Optional Routes.—One way or round trip tickets reading between Cleveland and points east of Pittsburgh via B&O RR will be honored between Cleveland and Youngstown by the Erie RR and between Youngstown and Pittsburgh by the P&LE RR.

One way or round trip tickets reading between Youngstown or New Castle and points east of Pittsburgh via B&O RR, will be honored between Youngstown or New Castle and Pittsburgh via P&LE RR.

Air-Conditioned Trains.—Air-conditioned equipment has been assigned to regular sections of trains as shown herein. Every effort will be made to provide it as specified, but the right is reserved to employ non-air-conditioned cars as necessitated by volume of traffic or emergencies.

Red Cap Porter Service.—Red Cap porter service is available at principal stations at a nominal charge per piece for hand baggage. Checks will be given passengers by Red Caps, to show where baggage is to be delivered—whether to coach or Pullman car.

National Travelers Aid Society.—Travelers Aid is a social service, supported by voluntary contributions, specializing in assistance to people away from home. Information, direction and help with any type of personal problem are available to all passengers. Look for the blue and white lamp in major terminals.

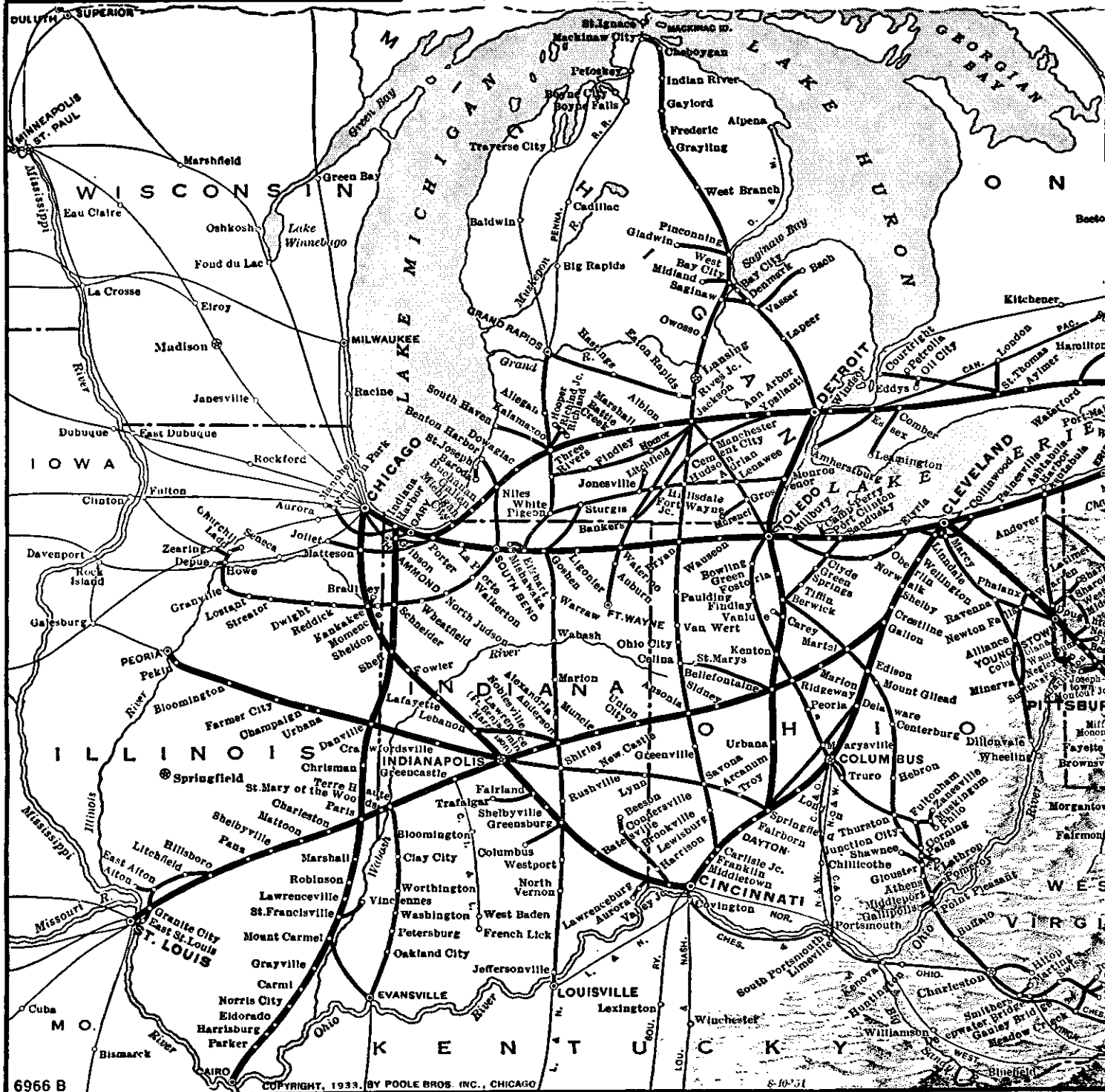

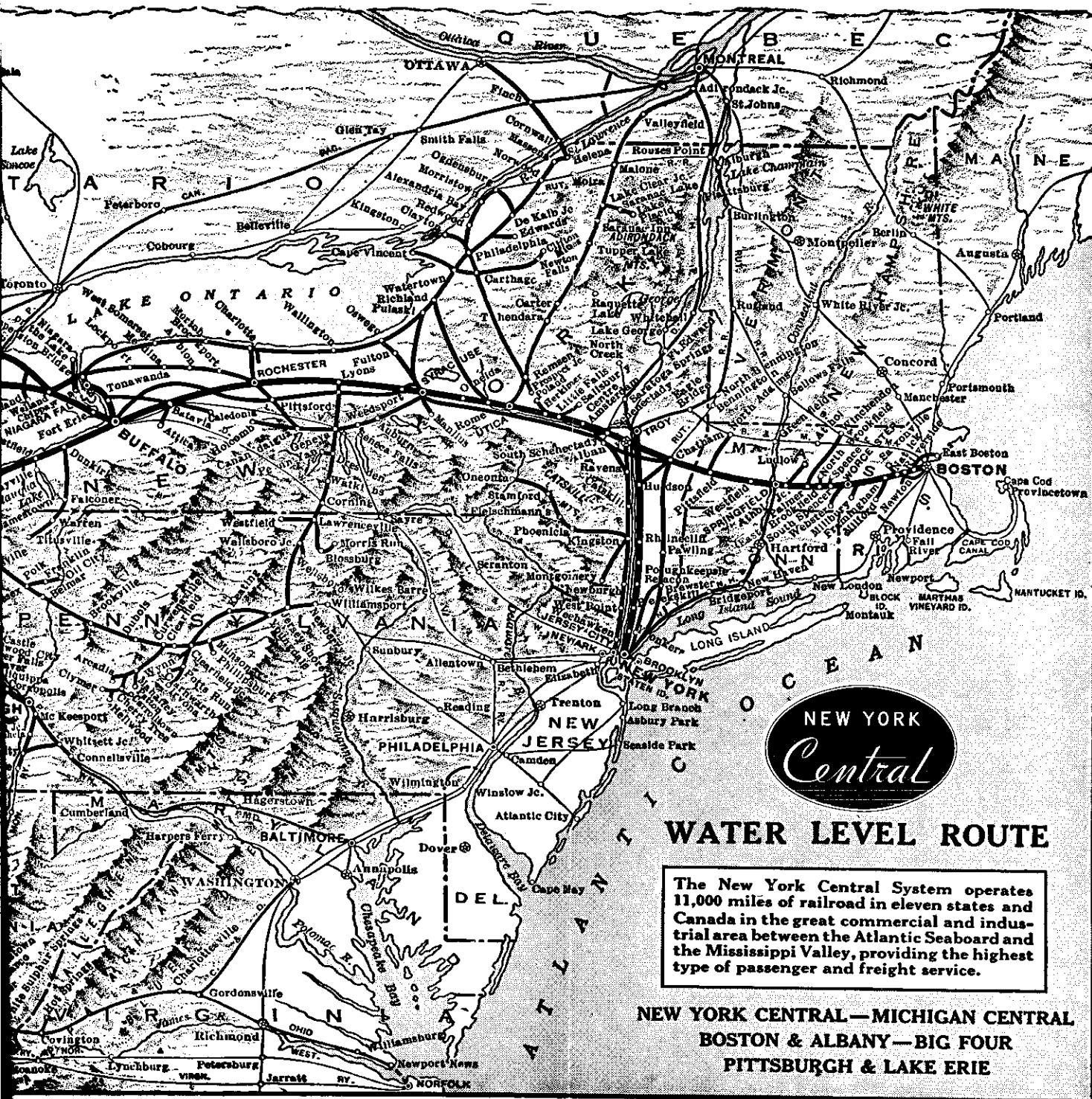

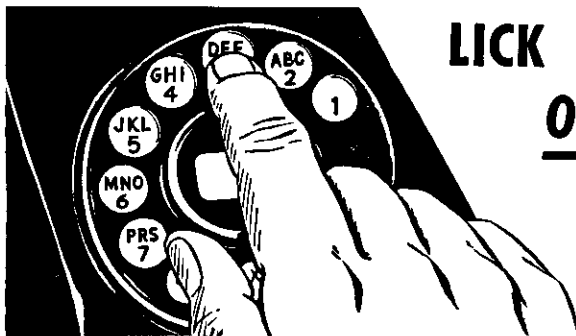
